

# ADMISSIONS POLICY 2022-2023

## Selection

Entry into NDSOPA is via audition.

We are a selective school which accepts pupils with a love of all aspects of Performing Arts.

All pupils must study a full academic programme alongside their performing arts training.

NDSOPA fully adheres to the 2010 Equality Act, especially in relation to the support of Protected Characteristics.

## Procedure

If students wish to transfer from NDSOPA to another school then we would require ONE TERMS NOTICE in writing to ensure that we can support you in a smooth transition - fees are still applicable for that time.

## **Assessing Out**

NDSOPA operates a policy of reviewing pupils' progress in the Spring Term of Year 9. Any pupil not felt at this point to be meeting the performance, academic or pastoral demands of the school will be given notice asking them to leave the school as of the end of the Summer Term in that academic year. In exceptional circumstances NDSOPA reserves the right to reconsider the position of any pupil within the school who is deemed not to be matching the expectation of the overall school curriculum at the end of any academic year.

## Transfer

NDOPSA does all it can to ensure that the transition of pupils from their previous school is as smooth as possible and that they are kept well informed of school policies, procedures and events. An entry pack of detailed information, such as term dates and uniform requirements, is sent to pupils and parents prior to entry in the summer term. Induction booklets are reviewed annually and given to pupils.

Tutors and staff discuss key issues with the pupils/pupils on arrival. Staff will do all they can to help and advise parents.

Having been offered a place, an acceptance form is submitted, together with the appropriate deposit.

Parents will be requested to indicate their acceptance of a place within one month of receiving the offer of a place. All places in years 7-11 are offered subject to a satisfactory reference from the pupils' current school. In addition, parents will be asked to complete a form providing details about their child to enable the School to prepare for the child's entry.

The parents will be asked to confirm on the registration form that they agree to the offer of a place on the basis of acceptance of the School's Terms and Conditions and Rules and Regulations.

## **PUPILS WITH DISABILITIES**
